



Pipper

QUICK START — GET GOING IN 5 STEPS — v3.36B

Pipper draws your trade plan on the Bookmap heatmap and tells you whether it's risk-neutral — without ever touching your orders. Here's the whole loop.

1 Install it

Bookmap toolbar → four-diamond add-ons icon → **Configure add-ons** → **Add** → pick the **Pipper jar** → tick to enable.

2 Bind your keys

Settings → **Keyboard shortcuts** → **Add-ons** → **Pipper**. Set **Long**, **Short**, **Clear**.
Numpad 1 / 2 / 3 works well (Bookmap won't take bare letters).

3 Drop a plan

Hover the price you'd enter at on the heatmap and press **Long** (or **Short**). Entry snaps to your cursor; the stop and target auto-place around it.

4 Adjust to your levels

Drag the stop and target lines where you want them. R:R, sizing, and the risk-neutral guide update live. Press **Clear** to reset.

5 Go risk-neutral

Set your contract count and watch the **gold** guide line — it always shows where to **sell N here** to reach neutral. When the entry badge flips to **✓ RISK-NEUTRAL**, your nearest target covers the stop on the rest — the runners ride on. Put a real position on and Pipper **dims the plan and tracks the live trade** on its own levels.

Free covers planning up to **2 contracts**, display-only — it never sends or modifies an order, and works on Bookmap's own data feed (no broker needed). **Pro** lifts the contract limit and adds automatic live-position tracking, a live ledger with open P&L, slippage-aware dollars, a protection checklist, and a closed-trade review (R:R planned vs achieved, max heat/run, time in trade) — these read your order and fill events, so they need a trading-capable broker feed (Rithmic, CQG Continuum, dxFeed, or Tradovate via Bookmap Global+); on one of those Pipper tracks live whether you trade for real or in Bookmap's simulator on that connection. Bookmap's own data feed is replay-only for now — native live tracking on it is pending Bookmap's approval (in progress); replay feeds the same events for practice on any data. Chart one instrument and route another (ES → MES) and Pipper prices the contract that fills automatically. **Choose a color scheme** (Classic / Blue-Orange / Monochrome / Blue-Amber / Calm — Calm is the default) and let Pipper **speak your alerts** (Windows voice; on by default; serialized so it never talks over itself). Settings live on six tabs (**Plan · Live · Visual · HUD · Voice · License**). Voice alerts include a **stop hit**, a working order that would **add beyond your protection**, and optional **warn-only risk-per-trade and daily-loss limits**. Tap **Check 6** any time to hear your status. Saving trades + journal export to HindSight / TraderLab 101 is coming soon. Currently in private beta — request a key at sean@sdes.dev.
